I continue to receive inquiries about renting space at the church. I added two nonprofit meetings (2x/week) at \$10/hour and two for profit at \$25/hour. One of the for-profit groups may be a one-time deal or could become ongoing depending on the response to it. The June wedding that was scheduled has been cancelled by the couple. We still have one scheduled in April. Overall, room rentals have increased. The MailChimp email listing was reduced by 40 emails for Members & Friends. We are charged based on the number of participants and most of those deleted had resigned their membership. I worked with the Transition Team to create the online survey in MailChimp as well as creating the paper version of the survey and assisting with processing the results.

Unfortunately, I was unable to attend because I was sick with COVID-19. The last few months we have been transitioning our communication methods due to the Morrel's no longer being here as of May. We have a Facebook page, LaundryLoveAVL where we post service information and message clients. We have also created a GoogleVoice account where clients can call us to request transportation and get service updates.

The LL team is going to meet in late February to discuss what is needed to continue to provide this service. Our most pressing need is to have one or two other adults provide transportation on LL Sundays. We continue to need money to support the cost of washers and dryers. Donations of dryer sheets and 30 gallon trash bags are also welcome at this time.
